- Core Competencies Task Force Update
 - 2.5 years since starting
 - Group is meeting for a structure list, and writing objectives for entry-level anatomy curriculum
 - Modified Delphi study working to gather information, and they are nearing the stage where they need consensus to finalize the findings
 - Hopefully within the next month they will be ready to ask for volunteers to help get that consensus on materials
 - Ramping up the "RPM's" of SIG Collaboration -

 - <u>*R*</u>esearch, <u>*P*</u>ractice and <u>*M*</u>entorship Collaboration Collective Survey & Discussion
 - Research collaboration is a goal of this initiative, able to have a large cohort quickly for different studies
 - Practice can bounce ideas off of each other when you have someone with similar backgrounds

- Mentorship when people get thrown into anatomy because "someone needed to teach anatomy"
- Updated Statistics
 - 52 Respondents (as of 2/12/2024)
 - 88.46% Onsite (45) /11.54% Hybrid (6)
 - DPT 80.77%, PTA 3.85%, Other 15.38% inc. Pros/Ortho, Med school, PA-C/PT, Residency
 - Lecture Hours = 30 to 105 Hours
 - Lab Hours = 20 to 130
 - Course Weeks = 8 weeks to 30 weeks (2 terms) to 16/16/10
 - Between 1 and 25 years of Anatomy teaching experience
 - 71% offer straight lecture (over flipped, team-based, case-based)
 - 80% cadavers (over prosections, models, plastinated cadavers, anatomy in clay, electronic)
 - 47/52 open to research collaboration
 - 46/52 open to practice/teaching collaboration
 - 41/52 open to mentorship
 - 25 willing to be involved as a mentor, 17 looking to be mentees. To find out who is willing, you need to go to the SIG site and see who has filled out the survey and is willing to mentor, they will find someone and reach out
- News from the Academy of Education (Chalee Engelhard)
 - Thanks to leadership for the work you've done
 - 2024 is the year of the member, they are trying to build membership and give robust tools to help people
 - Considering adding a board member director of scholarly engagement (move education research forward)
 - Membership is having a stronger voice, regularly meeting with Kim Varnado (president of ACAPT), also meeting with CAPTE, and APTA President Herr
 - Other Academies/Sections offer free student memberships, they have made a task force to establish the resources needed and to see the cost/benefit analysis of making student membership free
 - Excellence in PT Education certification update tonight at the meeting, there is good progress from that task force
 - Updates
 - Grants are available for small (2,500) and larger (25,000) grants
 - The Academy is in JOPTE
 - Helps facilitate getting research into practice
 - PTA Summit was great, House of Delegates was successful

 - Advertise that anatomy educators are willing to have an anatomy overview as part of presentations
 - Using cadaver photos as part of the review before a specific topic can be a great way to introduce the topic and people want to see it
 - We would like to have some resources on pathologies that you might see in cadavers
